Yesterday was committed to the county gaol, by John Mitchell, Esq; James Grant, charged with feloniously assaulting, on the 30th ult. Michael Seix, Esq; late a Captain in the 22d foot, on the high road near Urlingford.

On Saturday and Wednesday last, William Mahony stood in the pillory in Coal-market, pursuant to his sentence last assizes, for perjury.

Waterford, August 5. Saturday night some villain or villains burglariously entered the office of Messrs. Richard, Isaac, and Thomas Jacob, merchants, in King-street, and feloniously took thereout about thirty pounds in cash, the property of a junior brother.

Monday arrived the Carteret packet with the mail, Capt. Lloyd, his servants and horses, and other passengers.

Clonmel, August 4. Saturday last, Darby Morphy was executed at Gallows-hill, near this town, pursuant to his sentence, at the last assizes, for the robbery of the Widow Conway.

Committed, to our County Jail, the 1st inst. by Vere Hunt, Esq;—John Ryan, Darby Ryan, and Matthew Ryan, charged on oath with aiding and assisting several others, in assaulting, beating and wounding, James Ryan at the fair of Cappagh, in this county, on the 28th of July last, of which treatment the said James Ryan died in some hours after. They were committed to jail by the Sub-constables of the District of Kilmemana.

LIMERICK.

It is a melancholy consideration, that at this time when four men are about to suffer an ignominious death, for burglaries committed in this city, there are to be found wretches still practising similar crimes:—On Tuesday night, about 12 o'clock, the shop window of Mr. Shaughnessy, grocer, in Nicholas-street, was broke open, a large iron bar being first wrestled off; providentially the villains did not enter the shop, as it is imagined they were alarmed at the approach of a boy, who seeing the shutters in the street, apprised Mr. Shaughnessy of his danger; the bar was found in Bow-lane.

The last dispatches from Gibraltar brought advice of the death of Lieut. Col. Ferguson, of the 68th regiment, brother to the late Col. Ferguson, of the 27th.

Among several articles that went off last Monday at the fair of Limerick, to the satisfaction of buyer and seller, was a purchase made by a man of the name of Day, from another of the name of Minchan, of his wife, for the sum of ten guineas!
