He was happy to find that all their Lordships had entertained the fame ideas of the very atrocious crime of rioting; and hoped the common people, who but too generally thought it a trifling offence, would be convinced, from this day's proceedings, that the laws were not to be trampled upon with impunity. The fentence, as propoled by Lord Hailer, was then pronounced.,

All their Lordships expressed great concern at the necessity they were under of inflicting fo severe a punishment upon a man, who, till thefe unhappy dillatbances took place, had behaved himfelf as a good and worthy citizen, and maintained in a decent manner a wife and fix children. He was, belides, far above the lower class, being a mafter weaver, and having a number of journeymen and other working

under him.

-AUGUST 9 .-

The Hamburgh Gazette, received this day, gives the following account of a fea-fight, between the Swediffs and Ruffian fleets, which took place on the 17th of last month. The Swedish fleet confished of 15 ships of the line-the Ruffinn fleet of 17. They come in fight near the island of Houghland, and an engigement foon after took place, The action commenced about five P. M. and continued till midnight, when the Rullian fleet was disperfed The iffue of the engagement proved to be, that the Swedes had funk one Ruffian man of war, and token another of 74 guns and 780 men. The Duke of Sudermania went the next day into Sweatourg with a thip of his ficet milling. It is thought the victory would have been more complete on the part of the Swedish Admiral, had not the disproportion of force, in respect to the fize and number of Alips, been to great between the two fleets. The account alds, that the Russian fleet is much shattered, while that of the Swedes has been very little damaged. The action took place about four fea miles off Revel in Livonia,

Mr. Fenwick, at Lloyd's, yesterday received a confirmation of the above intelligence.

There is a report, and we give it merely as fuch, that Admiral Greig was killed in the engagement between the Rushans and Swedes.
