

No official intelligence has been received at the Castle, relative to the Chancellor's place—Yesterday the Speaker declared the appointment would be with the Attorney General—yet on Saturday none of the Crown Lawyers had heard an iota of the business.

A letter from London of the first authority, to one of our most eminent mercantile houses here, says, "that the British Minister has freely declared to the West India merchants of London, that tho' a war was an event far from being improbable, yet, according to all appearance, it could not happen until after the month of March.

It is with great concern we announce the death of that worthy nobleman, Earl Nugent, who departed this life last night in Gardiner-strow, in the 82d year of his age.

Extract of a letter from Kingston, in Jamaica, dated August 6.

"The weather has been remarkably dry, vegetation is at a stand for want of moisture, the grass is burnt up, and scarce a drop of fresh water to be had; however, the season is not unhealthy, and we amuse ourselves tolerably well.

"We have had several plays performed by the officers in garrison here. Capt. —, of the 14th is manager, he played Scrub in the Beau Stratagem, and Lingo in the Agreeable Surprise, in as capital a stile as ever they had been played, and to very full houses, amounting to 230. each night, we have been favoured with several other pieces by the same gentleman, who contributed the profits to the most laudable uses. But the assemblies coming on, have put a stop to acting for a while."

Extract of a letter from Drogheda, Oct. 11.

"Yesterday morning, the Rev. Mr. Roe, a Roman Catholic clergyman, was found dead in his sister's apartments in West-street.—He was sitting in a chair with his head leaning on his hand, and is imagined to be in that situation two days. He was in a bad state of health for some time past."
