

The recent melancholy scenes at the Park, where the Duke of Rutland, and Earl Nugent's remains were laid out, must have made it not a very pleasing place for residence; and the air in a central part of the town, of all times of the year, is at present, and the ensuing month, the most unpleasant.—It cannot, therefore, be matter of surprize, that the elevated situation, and the unrestricted circulation of air which the Royal Hospital near Kilmainham enjoys, should become an object of Viceregal choice on the present occasion.

The remains of the late Colonel Talbot, were yesterday morning, privately interred in the family vault at Malahide.

On Saturday morning last, as soon as his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant heard of the death of Mr. Talbot, he immediately posted off to Malahide, and with a tenderness for the loss the family sustained by the death of this worthy gentleman, made an offer of apartments in the Castle for the family.
