As his Majesty's cabinet Ministers are determined at this most critical juncture to proceed with the utmost caution and a particular regard to the relative situation of this kingdom to Great Britain, as an independent realm of the Empire; one of the dispatches that arrived at Dublin Castle, last week, contained, as we are told, a requisition for six members of the Irish Privy Council to repair forthwith to London, in order to confer with the British council, and consider what steps may be necessary to pursue or measures to adopt, at so critical a period for the general safety of these kingdoms. The nomination, it is said, will take place this afternoon, and the Counsellors depart without delay.

The Dorset Yacht, which arrived here last week, after landing Lord and Lady Fortescue in Wales, is warranted to be at Holyhead the 7th of next month, in order to carry over our Lord Chancellor and his family. It is thought however, that his Lordship's presence in London, at this awful and interesting crisis, will be required, and his voyage post-poned for some days at least.

Yesterday the prayer in favor of his Majesty was read in all the places of worship, of every denomination, throughout this city; never was trouble more general than on the present melancholy occasion.

A solemn fast will be proclaimed, by order of the Privy Council, should his Majesty's health continue in its present precarious state, in order to invoke the God of mercies to restore him to his subjects and family.—The course of a few days will determine this matter, and should he be favourably restored, a general day of thanksgiving will be observed through every part of Great Britain and Ireland.

'Tis currently reported through town, that a certain author was a few days ago arrested on a Fiat, granted at the suit of a Gentleman of this city, for defamation.

Notwithstanding the late solemn decision in the Napper and Dutton cause, we understand that Lord Sherborne, one of the parties concerned, intends applying to have the verdict set aside, and to obtain a new trial.

Mr. Hartley having signified his decided resolution to decline all future parliamentary projects, unable from his years and the state of his health to undergo the fatiguing duties of a conscientious, and just representation of his constituents, leaves of course a clear field for the other candidates—of whom Mr. Tandy is one, notwithstanding what may have been urged to the contrary.
