We cannot give our readers a more convincing proof of the heart-rooted loyalty of the inhabitants of this kingdom, and their infinite anxiety for the fpeedy and perfect recovery of our beloved and most excellent Sovereign, than by informing them, that even the unfortunate debtors in the Four-Courts-Marfea, for a while, laid afide the hope of dawing liberty, and not only wished an Act of Grace, on the accession of a new Monarch, far-far removed, but, on Sunday laft, before the doors were opened for the admittion of ftrangers, they walked in tolemn procession, made a ferwent prayer, and repeated the anthem, " God ! fave the King !" on the truly awful and critical occasion. This by a let of miterable unfortunates, whole lituation, but for the hamane and philanthropic attention of the humane Marshal and his Deputy, would be intolerable, speaks the loyalty of brave Irishmen more emphatically than the polenic prolizity of many volumes.

A curious speciacie was exhibited to the populace at Tholouse the 16th of last month, which gives a firiking proof of the deteffation wherein the late tribunal (appointed on the 8th of last May) was held by the inhabitants :-About nine at night valt quantities of faggots were piled up at the Place de Salin in that city, on which a feaffold of twenty feet square was erecled On this, nineteen puppets, reprefenting the nineteen officers compoling the tribusal, were placed. The figures were made, by the ingenuity of the artist, to resemble the originals both in features and coifs, and each, clothed in u robe, was feated agrecable to his rank. By means of four large globes, and a number of torches, the tribunal was clearly visible to the spectators, and the same order was observed in the disposition of the puppets as when, on the 2d of June, the prototype meeting held their first assembly, and were forced to abandon their feats by the hiffes of the people. In this fituation and arrangement a mock trial was commenced, when a person habited as a courier and fuperbly mounted made his appearance, holding in his hand the King's declaration of the 23d of September, by which the true Magistrates of the nation were restored, and the Buillages again funk into that fignificance from which they fliguld never have been raifed? At this moment, by an irrefulible impulse, the forches, intended to give light to the speciators, were applied to the pile, and the fire reaching the figures, filled with powder, they were driven into the air and fell again in fireds on he scaffold. The rabble, looking on every hing contaminated which had been dellined to he fervice of this court, would not even fave one valuable pieces of timber forming a barrier and the pile, but with a fort of fury precipi-Wed them into the fire, gathering up the featmed remains of the members of the tribunal, way of rendering them executioners as well wichims. Upwards of twenty thouland permaffenibled on this ludicrous occasion, and accident happened.
