prace, as toon as the exigencies of this kingdom will permit ; a buftle is therefore naturally excited in the several counties of the kingdom, amongs the electors and the candidates mentioned, in" as prejudice or opinion fuggefts.

The flinnel manufacture of this country is now become an object of very great magnitude; and fome public spirited persons should endeavour to establish it in leveral parts of the kingdom; for at prefent, the manufacture of finnels is almost entirely confined to the counties of Wicklow and Wexford; and not a doubt remains, but the establishment of a flannel manufacture would be attended with very confiderable and permanent advantages,

A philosophical correspondent has acquainted ns with a method of hardening timber, which may be of importance, and in certain cafes can be attended with no trouble equal to the benefits. The mode recommended is simply to fink it in water, while green, for feveral years. This prevents the alkali, or that fall which furnishes the alkali in burning, from exhaling afterwards, and by those means the timber becomes almost as incorruptible as stone. It is evident that the exhaling of this falt and the rotting of the wood have fome very great connexion with each other, fince the more found any piece of timber is, the more falt it proportionably yields, and the wood which is rotten is found on trial to contain no falt at all The Venetians are famous for the foundacts of their thips, which do not rot as those of other nations, but endure much longer than any others, and it is in the manner above-mentioned that the timber is prepared.

The following curious mode of horfe-dealing took place a few days fince in this city : -Mr. Samuel Murphy, of Chatham-ffreet, advertifed a beautiful dark bay horfe for fale, in confequence of which a gentleman went to fee him, and afked his price; Mr Marphy an-Iwered 15 guiness, (17) 18. 3d.) The gentleman panfed a few moments, and faid he would give him nine-pence per pound for the horse, which was agreed to. He weighed exadiy 40cmt 21b amounting only to 16' 10' only two shillings and three pence lely than the price demanded. This appears to have been a very nice calculation between buyer and feller
