By private and authentic letters from London, received by last Friday's packet, we learn, that his Royal Highnels the Prince of Wales, difavows every kind of hereditary claim, as Heir Apparent, to become Regent; and that his Highness will accept of that high office, during the King's illnefs, with fuch limitations and restrictions as both Houses of Parliament shall think necessary, in trust for his Royal Father.

This conftitutional declaration of the Prince's has, it is faid, gained him the univerfal approbation of all ranks, as it shews that no person could prevail on his Royal Highness to adhere to a doctrine that would have ultimately overturned the British constitution, and eventually wrest from the brow of a tender Father (our fill beloved Sovereign) the royal di-

adem, with all Kingly prerogative.

Roper as incurring the verdict of Wilful Murder, is conformable to the refolution formed in feveral parts throughout England, that the furvivor in every duel should come under that dreadful dilemma.
