The House severally sat in Committee on the bills for granting to his Majesty additional duties on hides, beer, ale, &c. on cordage, &c. on postage of letters, on malt, on coffee, on stamps, for promoting the linen and hempen manusacture, and the bill to punish mutiny and desertion.—Went through the same, and ordered that they may be reported on Monday next.——The House resuming.

Lord Viscount RANELAGH, from the Committee of the whole House, to whom the same was referred, reported that they had gone through the tobacco bill, the French treaty, advancement of trade, loan duty and fugar trade bill; which being read a third time, were ordered back to the Commons.

The bill for granting to his Majesty certain duties upon carriages was read a second time,

and committed for Monday n. xt.

The CHANCELLOR of the EXCHEQUER, from the Commons, presented at the bur, the hawkers bill, the license duty bill, and the American intercourse bill; which were severally read a first time, and ordered to be read a second time on Monday, to which day the House adjourned.
