At a Meeting of the Governors of the House of Industry, in the Committee Room, 20th March, 1789.

The Rev. Doctor CREAGH, in the Chair. Present the Rev. Deane Hoare, Mr. Hill Phillips, John Ferrar, Esq; Ltut. Hill, Esq; and Dr. Creagh. The Treasurer having produced his Accounts from the 30th June last to the 12th Inst. and prayed that they may be examined, which being according minutely examined, and the several Vouchers produced, it appears that he was Debtor to the Charity for the above time, the sum of 167l. 10s. 5d. h. and Creditor the sum 268l. 9s. 4d. by which the Charity is indebted to the Treasurer the sum of 100l. 15s. 10d. h.

Resolved, that the above Accounts are confirmed and approved of.

The number of Poor now in the House appearing to be 45 Males and 51 Females, many of whom are Lame, Blind, and Lunatick;—the Governour view with the utmost satisfaction, the benefits derived from this excellent institution, whereby 2102 Persons have been relieved and fed at an expence not amounting to two-pence per Day, for each.

Resolved, That the Public in general, and the Governour in particular, are greatly indebted to Ltut. Hill, Esq; for his constant attention to this useful Charity since its commencement, and that he be requested to continue the Trusteeship, which Mr. Hill having declined for the present.

Resolved, that the election of Treasurer be postponed to the next Meeting.

Resolved, that application be made at the ensuing Assize to the County and City of Limerick Grand Juries, by the Chairman to grant the Presentments, which they are required to do by Act of Parliament.

Resolved, that Bridget Cole be elected House-keeper, and John Bassett, Bailiff for the ensuing Year.

Extracts of the different Acts of Parliament for support of the House of Industry.

Stat. 11. and 12 Geo. III. Cap. 30.—“And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, in order to create some Revenues for the said Corporation: at the outlet, That the Grand Juries of every County, County of a City, and County of a Town in this Kingdom respectively, for ever, may, and they are hereby authorized and required at every Spring Assizes to be held in the said Counties respectively, after the twelfth Day of February, in the Year of our Lord, one Thousand seven Hundred and seventy-three, to present in every County of a City or Town, to be raised by Presentment from off the Lands and Houses in that County, equally and rateably, before the first Day of November then next following, any Sum not less than One Hundred Pounds, nor more than Two Hundred Pounds; and from off the Lands and Houses of every County at large as aforesaid, any Sum not less than Two Hundred Pounds, nor more than Four Hundred Pounds, to be paid to the Corporation of the said Counties respectively, or to their Treasurers respectively, without any fee or deduction whatsoever, for the charitable purposes aforesaid, and to be assessed and collected as other County Taxes are; and for the said Tax hereby imposed, the Collectors thereof are hereby required to give to those who pay it, Receipts separate and distinct from those given for other Taxes.”

Stat. 23. and 24 Geo. III. Cap. 58.—“And whereas the Sums directed by the said Act to be raised upon the several Counties, Counties of Cities, and Counties of Towns respectively in this Kingdom have been found in many places insufficient for the charitable purposes intended: be it enacted by the Authority aforesaid, that when any Member of any such Corporation shall make it appear to one of the Judges of Assize for such County, County of a City, or County of a Town, that the Funds of such Corporation are insufficient for the purposes of the said Act, such Judge shall examine upon Oath into the state of the Funds of such Corporation; and if upon such examination such Judge shall find such Funds insufficient to answer the purposes of the said Act, he shall direct the Grand Jury of such County, County of a City, or County of a Town, to present
