Cip: 30 .- " And be it further enacted by the Authority giorefaid; in order to create some Revenues for the faid Corporations at the out-let, That the Grand Juries of every County, County of a City, and County of a Town in this Kingdom respectively, for ever, may, and they are herely authorized and required at every Spring Affizet to be held n the faid Counties respect vely, after the twel th Day of February, in the Year of our Lord, one Thousand feven Hundred and feventy-three, to prefeat to every County of a City or Town, to be railed by Presentment from off the Lands and Houses in that County, equally and rareably, before the first Day of November then next following, any Sum not less than One Hundred Pounds, not more than Two Hundred Pounds; and form off the Lands and Houses of every County at large as aforefaid, any Sum not less than Two Hundred Pounds, nor more than Four Hundred Pounds, to be paid to the Corporations of the faid Counties respectively, or to their Treasurers respect vely, w thout any fee or deduction what loever, for the charitable purpoles aforefaiti, and to be affeffed and collected as other Counry Taxes are; and for the laid Tax hireby imposed, the Collectors thereof are hereby required to give to those who pay it, Receipts separate and dist not from thole given for other Taxes."
