The advantages of those Inland Navigations have been so beneficially experienced in England, that plans of vest magnitude have been engaged in, whereby the whole country will foon be connected through its principal manufacturing parts By the junction of the Severn with the Thames, London, Brittol, Liverpool, and Hull, will derive important benefits-the distance to London bridge from the Severn, with all the windings of the Thames, being less than 170 miles by Oxford, &c. The advantages to trade, efpecially in war time, are firikingly apparent from this course, and the communication with Ireland will also be rendered free from the dangers of an enemy. A complete voyage from Briftol Quay to London-bridge may be performed, it is expected, in one week generally, at a moderate expence.
