The Dublin Packet, which, upwards of 12 months ago, sailed from Philadelphia for this port, has been a missing ship, it was generally thought that she had foundered at sea;—Thursday morning, however, it is said, she was captured on her passage by the Moors, and brought into Saltee, and the crew immediately sent into slavery, where every communication was precluded:—At length three of the sailors, (who are those who brought the account) having escaped to the sea side, seized a boat, and got safe to the coast of Spain, from which they are just arrived.
