#### D U B L I N, August 29.

Amongst the number of resugees arrived in Dublin from France, within the last ten days, was a nephew from the Archbishop of Cambray. This gentleman was a little pressed in his circumstances, and found means to negotiate a bill with an eminent trader in the name of Puget and Bainbridge. The copperplate was of that nature as to exclude every idea of suspicion. The chevalier l'industrie winged his slight before a discovery was made, and has touched for no less than 1491. Whether he has taken his passage by the packet, or taken his route by the way of Drogheda, is uncertain; but for the present he is in possession of the cash, and the losers must look to it.

At a late review in the Phænix park, the horse of a Lieutenant-Colonel received a ball in his shoulder, and which entered and lodged in his body. The poor beast, on receiving the shot, staggered, but did not drop. The ball seemed an intentional one, tho' it happened that the officer, the owner of the wounded horse, was luckily not mounted, tho' standing very near, at the time of the accident.

A foldier in the ranks, at the above review, was observed not to level his firelock in the usual direction, but obliquely; which gave such strong suspicion, especially as he was nearly in a line with the officer's horse, as to warrant his apprehension. He was accordingly sent to, and confined in the barrack prison, in order to be tried by a court martial; but contrived to make his escape, and though every pursuit was instantaneously made, has not been retaken.

The horse, mentioned to have been shot at the above review, died on Saturday last, and which is faid to have cost the Lieutenant-Col. upwards of fifty pounds.

When the Martinet, Colonel Burgoyne, of East India memory, was reviewing a private field-day, some years ago, at the Phænix Park, he was also shot at, and a poor man, one of the spectators, sell the victim of the attempt. In times of peace, there is no occasion to exercise the severity of Martinets. The seelings of man, in either peace or war, should not be urged beyond the bearance of humanity.
