The General Assembly of Philadelphia have  
passed a bill for the establishment of a militia;  
by which it is to be divided into two distinct  
bodies, a general and distinct militia. The ge-  
neral militia is to consist of all between eighteen  
and fifty-three years of age; they are to turn  
out one day in every year, and pay a certain  
small sum each to the support of the corps.—  
The select militia is to consist of a legion, con-  
taining 2048 rank and file. This corps is to be  
composed of volunteers, if such should offer;  
if not, the deficiencies to be made up from the  
general militia by lot. This corps is intended  
as a military school, from which the State is to  
be furnished with a good militia, and always  
will thus be prepared for defence.

The Revenue in France will, for the present  
year, be deficient at least eight millions of  
pounds sterling, owing to the want of collect-  
ion during the troubles, to the depredations  
committed on the national property, and to the  
suspension of commerce and manufactures: In  
the present situation of France, that is a cala-
