Guernfey and Jerfey want nothing but a Trial or Jury, as having already an Atlembly of their States .-Conjecture may, however, reach fo far, as to affert that, in process of time, even the natives of the Malabar and Coromandel coaffs will feek that palladium of British and Irish freedom, though faid to be inconfistent with Eastern principles from the remotelt periods of hiltory to the prefent; but furely no people in the world would give a preference to gloomy delpotifm, when contrafted with conftitutional freedom, which carries in its pure and refplendent train; fecurity of life, property, and the effentials of every earthly bleffing.

Mr. Necker obferves, in his report to the National Affembly, that the King of England enjoys the privilege of an abfolute Veto, but would not dare to ule it; but with all due deference to the information of fo great a charucter, English; and oftentimes Irish bills, which had got the fanction of both Houfes, have been culhioned by the advice of the British Privy Council. When any reprefentation has been made for the return of fuch bills, the anfiver given is not indeed in the language of abfolure refufal, but in the following French exprofilion, " Le Roi s'amifera," the King will confider of it.
