It was also afferted, that there was large body of Royalids at Luxembourg; that e regiment of Orleans cavalry was within 15 agues of Paris, and was ordered to be ready march at a moment's warning.

The injury which the commerce of France as fullained from their commotions, is almost reparable. At Rouen, Bourdeaux, Nantz, &c. any of the most considerable houses have faili; and as they had enjoyed credit to an unmited extent, the mischief will be the more

idely extended.

It has been whispered in the polite circles, hat there is likely to be a ferious mifunderanding in the Cabinet, in consequence of a ertain great law officer at the head of his deartment having positively resused to affix the Breat Seal to Mr. Eden's pension. It is cerain, that fome measures lately adopted have een much difapproved by the high character lluded to, and given resson to furmise, that a efignation of his office may not be far diffant. Ve truft, however, that an accommodation vill be effected, and that the prefent flourishing late of affairs in this country may not be interupted by divisions among ourselves.
