The Magistrates of Paris, who are perfectly under the direction of the mob, have not observed less caution in making the King and Queen *close prisoners*—for it is understood that his Majesty will not be permitted without the gardens of the Thuilleries, until he has given his sanction to the whole of the new Constitution, as well as whatever else the people are disposed to make him sign. He will not even have the privilege of his meanest subjects, and no person is to have access to him, but such as the Magistracy approve. The Palace is now converted into a Bastile for the Sovereign.

The King has been even deprived of his ordinary attendants among the Noblemen of his Court; several having been refused a lodging in the Palace; the attendants of the Queen are likewise reduced to a smaller number than usual. The people are so fearful of a surprize, that the Palace has every appearance of a citadel; a very numerous guard of the Burghers do regular duty every two hours. More than 400 cannon are placed about the avenues of the Royal residence, though rather after the manner of a siege, than for defence, the guns being pointed towards the palace.

On this state of affairs, the National Assembly are removing fast to town, as no more business is to be done at Versailles—preparations are making for their reception at the Louvre, *within the Gardens of the Thuilleries*. They are not without great anxiety at his Majesty's being committed to the protection of the Parisians;—this proceeding has entirely lost them their consequence, and they have now only to pursue those measures the city approves, for who of the Members will dare to oppose them?

In fact, if the Government of France can be defined to be in the hands of any one power—that power is certainly the MOB, for, although the latter is a very indefinite term, yet every matter of importance has been dictated by them.

Dispatches from France of a private nature were delivered to his Majesty on Sunday.— They came by particular exprefs. What the contents were, can only be surmised. They were supposed to come from the unhappy Louis.

The Queen of France at this moment experiences all the insult that resuscitation can effect: the supposed treasures sent to the Emperor are again the topic; and JOSEPH himself is reviled for *famine* in the land!

Two frigates are immediately to be put in commission at Chatham, the Pandora and another, to cruize, it is said, off the coast of America, but is generally supposed that they are to convy the convicts to Botany Bay.

The King, Prince of Wales, Duke of Cumberland, &c. had a hunt on Saturday at Windsor.

At the anniversary meeting of the Electors of Westminster, held on Saturday, at which Mr. Fox presided; old MACKLIN sung a humorous song, with much more propriety, and more feeling at *ninety*, than half the beaux of twenty would have shewn on a similar subject.

The Right Hon. Richard Longfield is appointed Joint Governor of the county of Cork.

The St. Patrick, Murray, from this Port, arrived at Gravesend, the 6th inst. as did the Fame, Meredith, on the 11th.

Notwithstanding a public notice to all beggars to appear at the Poor House on Thursday last, not one appeared only three old men, who were admitted into the house, and two vagrant women who were compelled into it. All strange beggars found in town will be punished according to law, viz. for the first offence put in the Stocks; for the second offence, imprisoned two months; for the third offence, whipped; the Governors will pay six pence per mile for any beggar of the county sent in by a Magistrate, all of whom are Governors of the House. It is therefore hoped the inhabitants of the county and city will not encourage by any means, sturdy beggars and idle vagrants, who are all able to work for their bread. A collection will be made for the Poor House, when every humane person will have an opportunity of contributing to that extensive charity, and most excellent Institution, where human misery may be seen in every wretched form. Benefactions will be received by Mr. FERRAR on Sir Harry's Mall.
