He observed that it was incumbent on the Corporation of the city, to take fuch fleps as would fecure the poor of this metropolis from experiencing fuch diffrefs as would unavoidably enfue if the prefent great exportation was not stopped, and concluded with moving, That a meffage be fent to the other house, proposing that a Committee should be formed, and empowered to make application to Government, for a prohibition to the exportation of corn for a limited time, which was agreed to, and fent to the Board for their concurrence.
