Extract of a letter from Paris, Oct. 20. " It is impossible to conceive the prefeat state. of distraction in this metropolis. All is confufion, apprehension and millruft. Without law, without government, without police, and confequently without protection. What will be the event, it is impossible to conjecture. If I might hazard an opinion, it is, that it will end in a restoration of absolute monarchy. Le Fayette has loft much of his popularity. The republicans quarrel much among themselves; they debate; they order; they countermand; they do much, and they do nothing! They began without a plan. Every individual is a legillator. The people are in a flate of con tinued intexication. All commerce, and all manufactories are at a fland. The kingdom is impoverished, and the people want bread :-Mean while the King and Queen feem perfectly religned to their fate; but I am much mittaken if a ludden resolution to the army will not very toon produce another revolution in favour of the degraded Monarch. Foreign troops are cettainly expedied on the frontiers, and there is great reason to believe that the French troops begin to repent of the steps they have taken; and I am very certain that the bulk of the french nation with heartily for a reltoration of their ancient form of government."
