The KING against CARR.

On Tuefday lati, the prisoner George Carr, was brought up to the bar of the Court of King's Bench, when the Judges proceeded to deliver their opinion on the arrest of judgment, pleaded on behalf of the prisoner, Carr, in Michaelmas term last, who was tried in July commission, 1790, before the Hon. Mr. Juitice lienn.

The charge was, for forging and uttering a bill of exchange purporting to be drawn by Riggs Faulkner, and directed to John Harman, Jonathan Hoare, and Jerm. Harman, of the city of London, merchants, requiring them to pay to the order of Richard Browne, the fum of 3481. 6s. 8d. at 31 days after fight, and place same to the account of Sir Riggs Faulkner, Bart.
