ment of M. Villequier; and that we might not be perceived, we went feparately, and at fome dillance of time from each other.

(Signed) "MARIE ANTOINETTE." The declarations being read, M. Tronchet faid, "The King is defirous to have a duplicate of these declarations-without doubt the Affembly will authorize us to deliver them."

The Affembly complied with the request, and ordered the declarations to the committee which shall be appointed to make a report on this affair.

The Affembly then proceeded to the difcuffion of the penal code, and decreed feveral aricles.

PARIS, June 30. Yefterday, and the day before, it was industriously reported, that the King had become fo outrageous as to break the looking glaffes and furniture in his apartments —that he had ftruck feveral National foldiers, and even given M. la Fayette a box on the ear, It does not, however, appear, that these reports are well founded.

It was on Saturday reported, that the Emperor had demanded his Sifler's liberation, and had delivered, through his Ambaffador, a reprefeatation against the late proceedings of the National Affembly, in which he intimated his intention to affist the King of France in the recovery of his prerogative, and fignified that in this defign he was joined by many Princes of the Empire, and feveral of the Crowned Heads of Europe.

Among a variety of reports respecting the nature of the dispatches brought by Mr. Hammond from Madrid, it is generally understood that repeated applications having been made to Count Florida Blanca, to appoint commissioners to fettle those atticles of the conentvion which required a reference, he had in the most positive terms fignified, that the King, his master, meant to take his own time, and would not be dictated to by any power in the universe.
