Extract of a letter from Trin, Aug. 13.

"Yesterday came on to be tried before Mr.  
Justice Kelly and a special jury of this county,  
an action of assault and false imprisonment  
brought by Mr. Cottingham, a gentleman of  
the bar, against Wm. Garnett, the Deputy So-  
vereign of the borough of Kells.

"On the trial it appeared, that Mr. Cot-  
tingham had been brought specially from Dub-  
lin on the part of the Crown as council at a  
Revenue trial, before the sub-commissioners at  
Kells. The revenue officer, a Mr. Herdan  
(whose information was the subject of trial) was  
during the course of the business arrested on a  
town action for debt, and brought before the  
Sovereign, who was about to commit him, when  
Mr. Cottingham, from motives of humanity, in-  
terfered in his behalf and paid the debt for him.  
—Some mistake arising as to the amount of the  
demand, Mr. Garnett used some very coarse lan-  
guage, which Mr. Cottingham expressed his  
disapprobation of—Garnett instantly seized on  
Mr. Cottingham, and threatened to put him in-  
to the stocks, and was actually proceeding to do  
so, but for the interference of some gentlemen  
who came up at the instant and informed him  
who Mr. Cottingham was. Garnett immedi-  
ately retracted and excused himself by pleading  
his not having known him, and his having taken  
him for an excise officer. Mr. Cottingham de-  
clared the insult too gross to be so lightly par-  
doned, and that the offence was such as de-  
manded a public punishment from his country,  
for so wanton an abuse of the authority en-  
trusted to him.

"The Jury without hesitation, and with a  
full approbation of the learned Judge and of a  
crowded court, found a verdict for 100l. da-  
mages with costs.

"Every gentleman of consequence in the  
county attended on this occasion."

A shocking accident happened on Sunday, at  
Boosterstown.—A young lady, with whom a fee  
of one hundred guineas had been given to a  
milliner, a few months since, went on a visit  
to an acquaintance, who lodged there for the  
benefit of sea-bathing, and was induced to go  
into the water. Never having gone into it be-  
fore, she was very much agitated, and two la-  
dies who accompanied her, very imprudently  
took advantage of her fright, and threw her  
down, with an intention of ducking her. In less  
than one minute she was suffocated, and com-  
pletely deprived of life. The terror of her com-  
panions may be easily imagined on so dreadful  
a catastrophe.

A Coroner's Inquest was held on the body,  
but not until two o'clock, and brought in a  
verdict of accidental death.
