 by Mr. Lindsay, who arrived this morning, of
 the result of the negotiation at Peterborough,
 his Majesty's Servants are of opinion that there
 no longer exists any reason why the Russian
 Merchants should not proceed in the usual
 course of their Commerce without any appre-
