ous and numerous gang of robbers, who some months past committed several burglaries in this neighbourhood, particularly at Mr. Hezekiah Holland's, at Crossagallow, and at Patrick Keating's, near Sixmile-Bridge, in the county of Clare, on the 21st of December last, on which night they were prepared to break into the house of John Singleton, Esq; of Ballygrenno, in said county, but two of the gang getting intoxicated, they thought proper to decline it until another opportunity; several other gentlemen's houses in the counties of Clare, Limerick, and Tipperary, were marked out to be visited by this gang, which by the spirited reception they met at Mr. Palmer's, has been rendered abortive; and it now remains with the respective Magistrates and Gentlemen to be active in scouring the country of the remainder of those desperate villains.

Last night Sheriff Sargent, assisted by the High Constable, and Mr. George Davis, apprehended John Gallagher, butcher, in his own house outside Thomond-gate, and lodged him in the City Jail; he was one of the above mentioned gang, and is particularly charged with being at the several burglaries before recited: from the candid unequivocal confession and discovery of Thompson, there is every reason to hope more of those villains may be brought to justice.

Encouragement for Agriculture.

AT a Meeting of the Brewers and Malsters of the City of Limerick, at the Mercantile Coffee-House, on Monday the 19th of December, 1791, to take into Consideration Measures necessary to be adopted, to remedy the Grievances which they now labour under; it appearing from the light quality of the Barley, grown in the County of Limerick, and parts adjacent, that a very considerable Charge of Revenue is brought against them, more than in many other parts of this Kingdom.

That the Revenue on Malsters being charged by Gauge only, and the kind of Grain generally brought to Limerick being of inferior quality of Bere and Barley, and of a light thin body, occupies more space than Grain of a fuller substance, by which the Charge is increased at least ten-pence per Barrel Duty, more than Barley grown from English Seed.

RESOLVED, That for want of a proper kind of Grain for Malting, the Brewing Business in the City of Limerick is on a decline, and must in a short time be inevitably stopped, without the exertion of the Farmers of the County, to improve the Agriculture of English Barley.—That at present the Import of English Porter is alarming to the Breweries of Limerick, and the Land-Holders of the County, whose dependance is chiefly on the consumption of their Corn for the payment of their Rents.

Therefore, in order to encourage the Agriculture of this County, in the Growth and Improvement of English Barley, which we consider to be the only means to remedy the Evil complained of,

RESOLVED, That we will in future pay One Penny per Stone more for Barley than Bere.

RESOLVED, That after the 29th September next ensuing, we will not buy any other Grain for Malting than Barley.

RESOLVED, That any Farmer bringing Bere or Barley to Market, not screened from dirt or light grain, or not answering the sample, we will not purchase or receive it on any terms.

RESOLVED, That for the encouragement of English Barley we will provide against the next season for sowing Barley, a quantity of the best English Seed Barley, and deliver the same one Shilling per Barrel, less than the Market Price of the most inferior Barley, on the Farmers making affidavit the Barley so got, shall be sowed on his land, and not appropriated to any other purpose, and in two Months after the said Barley is sowed not exceeding more than fourteen stones to the Acre, sworn before the most convenient Justice of Peace, shall receive a further encouragement of one Shilling per Barrell, to be paid them by the Committee of the Malsters and Brewers, for such Barley as has been satisfactorily proved to have been sold in this Market.
