At a Meeting of the Common Council of the City of
Limerick, the following Address of Instructions to
the Representatives of said City, was Resolved.

To the Honourable Edmond Henry Pery, and
John Prendergast Smyth, Esq.

GENTLEMEN,

THE Important Question to what extent
the Constitution will admit, further indulgence to
our Roman Catholic fellow subjects, having been intro-
duced into the House of Commons, we feel ourselves
now called upon, however we might have passed over
the numerous exceptionable publications on the subject,
to entreat you for the benefit of the Empire at large,
but this Kingdom in particular, you will exert your-
selves, in resisting any attempt that may be made to
injure, either immediately or in its consequences, the
Protestant Establishment in Church or State.

[Signed by near Four Hundred Persons, composed of
the Mayor, Sheriffs, Recorder, and Fifty Three
Members of the Common Council, Sixteen of the
Clergy, with other Citizens and Protestant Inhabi-
tants.]
