As this question materially concerns not only the whole of the Merchants, Traders, and Manufacturers of Dublin, but those of the Nation at large, we shall lay before the Public a candid report of the proceedings of the intended Aggregate Meeting; and we recommend it firongly to our fellow citizens not to bind themfelves to any particular measure, until they have heard the arguments to be offered on both fides of the

queltion.
