A mine of Black Lead (Spendo Golena) of a very fine kind, has been lately discovered in Ayrshire in Scotland. As the mine in Camberland, from which all the pencils are made, is supposed to be nearly exhausted, this new source will be of much pecuniary advantage to the possessor, and utility to the public. On the estate a good hone quarry has been found, which will supersede the necessity of importing stones from Holland.

Last Friday arrived in this harbour, the Dunleary barge, commanded by Mr. Forward Rumley, surveyor of Dunleary, with a large smuggling wherry, laden with tobacco and spirits, which he seized the 13th inst. after many hours chase.

The General Washington, belonging to Philadelphia, Captain Davis, arrived here on Saturday evening last from thence,—last from Havre de Grace.

Capt. Davis had but twenty-three days pas- sage from Philadelphia to Havre de Grace, where he landed his cargo, which consisted of 3000 barrels of flour.

When Captain Davis sailed from Havre de Grace, which was eleven days ago, there were twenty-two Philadelphia vessels lying there, after discharging their cargoes, which consisted entirely of flour.

On Thursday night last, Inspectors Shee and Edmonds, of the Police, having had informa- tion of a great quantity of valuable goods, stolen from different people, being deposited in an infamous house in Crane-lane, kept by one Corish, they proceeded to search said house, in which they found, among many other things, several articles of womens apparel, the pro- perty of a mantuamaker, in Clarendon-street, and Mr. Findlay, staymaker, of Eustace-street, both of whom had been robbed some time since. The woman of the house was lodged in Newgate. The man has absconded.

A Clergyman lately called out a young Officer in England, who took some liberties with his cloth, and on the second fire winged the Son of Mars; after having thus amicably settled the quarrel, the Clergyman's friend was asked by an Irishman, who stood by, what Church he belonged to; to which he replied— to the Church Militant.

Wexford, June 19. On Sunday evening a woman came into the shop of Mr. William Foley, apothecary, in this city, and asked for a vomit for some man living in Little Barron- strand-street, whom she said was a little in- disposed. The young gentleman in the shop gave her a small quantity of tartar emetic, with directions to mix it with a due proportion of water, and to take a table-spoonful at a time, till it operated. The patient obeyed the instructions, in the first instance; but finding no effect from one spoonful, rashly took the re- maining part, which unfortunately proved his death in a ut three hours after. The above premature accident should be a lesson of cau- tion to people not acquainted with the nature of medicine, to obey the directions given them.

Ennis, June 18. Last Saturday the High Sheriff of this county received a respite to stay until further orders, the execution of Daniel Callaghan, who, at our last Assizes, was found guilty of horse stealing, and ordered to be hanged on Saturday the 14th of July next.

We hear that a gentleman has discovered some very curious petrifications in the lime-stone quarries on the North Strand and Shelburne- road, in the neighbourhood of this city: They consist chiefly of cockle-shells, and those curious shells called *Cornua Ammonis*; some pieces of stone have been found which have the appear- ance of petrified bones.—The cockle-shells are bedded in large rocks of lime-stone, and are so perfect as to leave no doubt of their origin.
