**EAST-INDIA INTELLIGENCE.**

DELHI, June 9.

**T**HE son-in-law of Mohummud yar Aga, who is just returned from the Northern countries, represented to his Majesty, that a person called Gouher Khan, has appeared there, setting up pretensions to the Crown. He has with him ten thousand Abyssinians, ten thousand Arabian match-lock men, with other troops, but chiefly infantry.

He has coined a Rupee, of the value of fourteen Marhas, with an impression in the Chinese character, of which the following is the translation.

- "Scourge of the unbelievers of the world,
- "Source of the light of divinity;
- "Ornament of the faithful of Mohummud;
- "Vicegerent of Ali;"
- "Subduer of the seven kingdoms of the world,
- "Lamp of the road of true happiness, temporal and eternal. Preserver of the faith of
- "Mohummud, Muhudi the last of the Apostles."

This Pretender to the Throne, is represented to have a very fine army, rich and liberal, but austere in the execution of his commands. His standards are green, of which he has four.

He performs the five prayers—and in every respect adheres firmly to the rites of the Mahomedan faith.

LONDON, JULY 20 & 21.

The Kings of Hungary and Prussia are said to have advanced a sum of money to the French Emigrants: but on condition, that the application of it shall be superintended by a Prussian and an Austrian Commissary.

At Coblenz a Prussian soldier has been shot for having taken it in his head to preach liberty to two citizens. His body served afterwards as a stool, on which the two citizens received each 50 blows with a stick. The Magistrates of Liege have visited all the shops, and seized all three coloured ribbands they met with. It is said that M. Dumourier is now at Coblenz.

The interesting cause between the nobility of Courland on the one part, and the Duke and the Commons on the other, is finally decided, and in almost every point against the nobility. By this decision the commons are entitled to sit in the States; nothing in which they are concerned can be determined on without their participation, and all the determinations of the States, in which they did not participate, are annulled. They are no longer under the exclusive jurisdiction of the nobles in matters that respect their privileges, but a special commission is to decide all matters in dispute between the two orders.

In England we build Coaches for all parts of the world,—but a Chariot was last week landed at the Custom-house which was built in America, and sent over to an English family; this is the first instance of such an importation.
