

gence we are unavoidably led to a repetition of the same circumstances—but it is a repetition that surely cannot fail to please every well-wisher to his country.—Again we announce a progressive increase of the public income, which is the more acceptable, as we are now able to say, from authority, that the Minister means firmly to persist in his plans of retrenchment and economy; and that there are no existing engagements which are likely to involve this country in the intricacies and confusions which distract most of the other kingdoms of Europe. The British empire may securely enjoy its unrivalled and unexampled splendour in permanent and perfect peace.

The English Ministry have not yet departed from that line of *Christian Perfection* which is commendable. They will not retaliate on the Empress of Russia, who leagued against their country, lest war, nor do they help to support a Revolution, which destroyed the arbitrary power of France, their uniform enemy—this is returning good for evil—negatively.

Destruction by fire increases proportionably with the number of houses—this city, the most remarkable in Europe for the rapidity with which it is extending, is consequently now more liable to such accidents than it has been, and more attention should therefore be given to the means of preventing their fatal effects than might have been requisite before.

The Lord Chancellor has taken, for a long term of years, the Duke of Leinster's bathing villa at the Black rock. It is one of the handsomest and completest in that very agreeable outlet.
