POLISH SUBSCRIPTION.

Yesterday a numerous and respectable Meet-
ing was convened at the London Tavern, pur-
suant to the requisition and notice published
some time since by Mr. Smith, for the purpose
of raising a subscription in support of the li-
berties of the kingdom of Poland.

Mr. Smith opened the meeting with stating,
as is usual, the cause thereof; he adverted to
several letters which he had received upon the
occasion, some of them abounding with that
generous warmth consonant to the subject;
others in the more laconic style, containing only
their subscription, but all of them, in one re-
spect or another, perfectly to the purpose.

Among these was one from Lord George
Gordon, which, from the eccentricity of its
style, created no small emotions of laughter.
He stated his attachment to the kingdom and
government of Poland, his concern for the
troubles which annoy that kingdom, his reason
for the same, "being his connection with the
tribe of Gad," his uniform principles of liberty,
and, ultimately, his relationship as a son of
Adam, to the reigning family of Poniatowski-
and, finally, the letter contained his mite—
good wishes.

Mr. Francis delivered his sentiments, ad-
verting to the late political situation of this
country with regard to Russia; and concluded
his remarks with a solemn appeal to the gene-
rosity of a free people, in the cause of a de-
serving Monarch.

Several other gentlemen spoke to the same
effect; and after a variety of remarks upon the
various Resolutions proposed, the Thanks of
the Meeting were voted to the Chairman, and
a subscription was immediately entered into.

The Lord Mayor and Sheriffs were said to
have put down their names for 100l. each.
The Meeting then adjourned.

DUBLIN, AUGUST 9.

The British Minister has lately required Pa-
terns of Scotch Manufactures, to have them
sent to China, for the encouragement of North
Britain; but he has forgotten to pay Ireland a
similar compliment: had there been a question,
however, of providing for a branch of the
Royal Family, giving a pension to a Dutchess,
for secret services, a reward to an Officer, who
nobody knows, manning the English Navy, or
recruiting the Asiatic Armies, this kingdom
would be the first applied to, and her Ministers
not the last to open the purse of the nation
with profusion, to so selfish and ungenerous
government.
