DUBLIN, AUGUST 16.

Yesterday the post-boy conveying his Majesty's Mail of Letters from this office, was stopped about two o'clock this morning, in Stoney-batter, by a single robber, who robbed him of the whole of the mail, containing the post-bags to Navan, Kells, Old Castle, Virginia, Cavan, Belturbet, Limeskea, Killishandra, Ballyconnell, Enniskillen, Kish, Churchhill, Ballyshannon, Killybegs, Donegal, Nairn, and Rutland.

On Saturday last, Baron Power, who had been prevented by indisposition from going the circuit, set off for Spa. It is the general opinion that this gentleman will shortly resign the Exchequer, and be raised to a seat in the Upper House: His legal abilities and constitutional knowledge, will therefore still, in some measure, be employed in the public service.

The Solicitor General is talked of as likely to succeed Baron Power in the Court of Exchequer.

There is a report in this city, which, tho' we have not been able to trace its origin, yet, from a number of concurring circumstances, it seems to have some foundation. It is, that the British Cabinet is determined upon making a vigorous attempt to unite the Legislatures of Great Britain and Ireland; in a word, to effect what is generally called a UNION. For this purpose, it is said, the visit of an English peer, at this time, has more in it than a jaunt of pleasure, and to see his Irish kinsfolks. He is, they say, a scout, sent to prepare, by innuendos, the public mind for what is to follow.

It was yesterday asserted, on the faith of letters received from Rotterdam, that the proposal made to the States-General of the United Provinces to join the confederate powers against France, had, at last been negatived by a large majority, notwithstanding a profusion of promises and bribes lavished without measure on the occasion.

The friends to this country and its rising manufactures, will be glad to hear, that an eminent English paper-manufacturer, [Mr. Taylor] has taken a situation in the vicinity of this metropolis, where he purposes to construct works on an extended scale with a capital of 30,000l.
