DUBLIN, AUGUST 16.

Yesterday the post-boy conveying his Majetty's Mail of Letters from this office, was stopped about two o'clock this morning, in Stoney-batter, by a fingle robber, who robbed him of the whole of the mail, containing the post-bags to Navan, Kells, Old Castle, Virginia, Cavan, Belturbet, Linefkea, Killishandra, Ballyconnell, Enniskillen, Kish, Churchhill, Ballyshannon, Killybegs, Donegal, Nairn, and Rutland.

On Saturday laft, Baron Power, who had been prevented by indisposition from going the cireuit, fet off for Spa. It is the general opinion that this gentleman will mortly refign the Exchequer, and be railed to a feat in the Upper House: His legal abilities and constitutional knowledge, will therefore ftill, in some meafure, be employed in the public fervice.

quer.
