Sunday a boy fell into the Canal harbour near James's-street, and by the draught of the several packet and lumber boats moored there, was instantly sucked under them. A foldier passing at the moment saw the boy sink, and dived after him immediately with his clothes on: after several efforts continued for a quarter of an hour, he brought the body on shore, but life was departed, and every possible assistance administered to restore it was in vain.

The setting in of the rains the last week has caused serious alarms for the safety of the corn-harvest, just commenced in the centre and southern countries of the kingdom. Their violence on Friday and Saturday last, have already been attended with considerable damage in the counties of Meath and Kildare; the river Liffey has overflowed its banks in divers places, and yesterday morning, at day-break, the works of the new-bridge constructing at Palmerstown, under the direction of Mr. Roche, were swept away by the violence of the torrent that came down.
