Last Saturday a shocking accident happened
near Ballymacreefe, in this County, occasioned
by the drying of flax in the cabin of John
Fahy; he and his wife were burned in a most
dreadful manner, and their two children in-
stantly burned to death; on Saturday Fahy
and his wife were received into the Lock Hos-
pital, at John's-gate.

hundred thousand pounds, sterling, value of
grain and flour sent from Ireland to other coun-
tries, making a prodigious influx of wealth to
the nation.
