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placed a large transparent painting of Her Majesty Q. Charlotte, crowned by Britannia; every Window displayed a lustre of lights, the Band of Music and Drums continued the favorite airs of Long Live the King, and Rule Britannia, until a late hour, which airs were received by a select Company entertained at the mess-room—the Regiment in general testifying their attachment to His present Majesty and Government.—If such troops are represented as a MERCENARY BAND, may the loyal and peaceable Inhabitants of Limerick ever have such Soldiers, to assist the Civil Magistrates.

The bodies of all the poor persons, overwhelmed by the moving Bog of Poulard, have been found;—in one house the mother, who was pregnant, was sitting up in her bed, with her arms so encircled about her four children, that the corpses were with difficulty separated, her husband standing over them with his back against the wall, in the posture of endeavouring to support it;—other families in situations which were equally affecting proofs of the rapidity of the calamity, and awful warnings to all, how sudden and unexpected may be their summons to render an account of their actions in this World!

With pleasure we can inform the Public, that the Rev. Doctor Maunfell's experiment on the Culture of Potatoes from the shoots only, is the greatest discovery that has been made in Agriculture for a Century past: The Mayor, John Tuthill, Richard Harte, and Philip Russell, Esqrs. attended the digging of them a few days ago; they tried two drills, and to their very great astonishment, found them amazingly thick and large, and the finest they had ever seen, and of different kinds; they made the labourer dig the same length of a bed sown with Potatoes at the same time, and though three drills are supposed to contain a bed of potatoes, yet upon weighing the potatoes in each, Doctor Maunfell's culture in the two drills from the shoots of potatoes, weighed double what was produced in the bed; in short the Doctor has reduced the culture of potatoes from the shoots, to a perfect and certain system, which will be a saving of upwards of half a million sterling to the poor of this kingdom every year.—We hear that he has wrote a treatise on the Culture of Potatoes, and in particular on the Culture of them from the Shoots, which we hope he may shortly favour the Public with; it were to be wished, that the Countrymen, who have their Potatoes stored in heaps, would preserve shoots sufficient to try the experiment the next season, as the Culture is less expensive and requires no seed Potatoes.
