LONDON, Feb. 7, 8, & 9.

The French have commenced hostilities against this Country-They have captured the Pearl, of Plymouth. She was taken by a rowboxt privateer on Wednelday night, and carried into Calais. Two Duich hoys have likewife been carried into that port.

Yefterday a Spanish courier arrived in town, express from the Court of Madrid, with dispatches to the Marquis del Campo, the Spaolfh Ambaffador in London. The meffenger came over to Falmouth in the Infanta man of war of 50 guns, after a passage of only two days and a half from the Groyne, which place he left the ift inftant. The mellenger has made one of the quickeft journies ever known, havperformed it in ten days.

He is faid to have brought over the news that the Court of Spain has declared war against France. The Courier is to wait the determination of the Court of London, to know in what manner it will be best for the two Courts to co-operate against the common enemy. The Spaniards will very fhortly have a sufficient force ready to protect the Mediter-

ranean leas,
