 off the point of Inge; the crews escaped, but
 the cargoes are totally lost.
 Died. Last Saturday, at his seat at Innisty-

 Waterford, March 5. Last Saturday our

 had been sunk, the boat they were in was over-
 set by a heavy squall of wind, when they all
 unfortunately perished.

 with corn from Ballylongford, was lost off Tarbert,
 and one of the Crew drowned.—Several other boats
 were driven on shore at both sides the river.
