LIMERICK.

Accounts by this day's Packet, mention that authentic advices were received in London, that the Austrian Army under Gen. Clairfait, had defeated the French, near Duren.—The French lost 10 pieces of Cannon, and had 400 men taken prisoners.

The Militia Bill has passed; 500 Men for each County, the King appoints the Colonels, the Governors of Counties the Officers, with the approbation of the Lord Lieutenant.

Thursday last a poor Woman of the name of Jane Stoker, a stranger, washing some of her garments at the slip on Lock-Quay, fell into the river, and floated so far as Mr. Honan's Quay, where she sunk, and remained about 5 minutes under water; every exertion was made for re-animation but without effect.

Yesterday, Captain Forbes, Commanding Officer of the 34th Regiment, received Orders from Government, for to keep the Regiment in readiness for actual Service; in consequence of which the two Companies at present in Clare, will be replaced by the Light Company of said Regiment, under the Command of Captain Roche, on Monday next.

Yesterday morning the Kite Cutter sailed for Cork, with all the outward bound Vessels under her convoy; the night before, the Kite made a seizure of 150 bales of tobacco, which was conveying by boat to the County of Limerick.
