LONDON, March 6 5 7.

Yellerday Lord Grenville delivered a meltage to the House of Commons from his Mujefty, stating, that " His Majesty having judged it expedient to employ in the fervice of Great Britain, a body of the Electoral Troops, for the purpole of flitting his Man jefty's Allies, the States General of the United Provinces, and of profecuing in the most effectual manner, the just and necessary war inwhich his Maj fty is engaged, his Majesty has ordered an estimate to be laid before the House of Commons, of the charge strending the employment of the faid Troops, and his Majesty relies on the zeal of his most faithful Commons; that they will be ready to make the necessary provision for maintaining the fame."-Ordered, that his Majella's most gracious Message be taken into confideration to-morrow.

The Dolphin packet, Capt. The young Prince of Orange who was the nominal Governor of Breda, had written to the Commandant to difregard any injury his father's effate might fuffain in that country by inundations, and to let loofe the fluices, and break down the dykes to the utmoft extent,-He conjured him to hold out to the last, and not to furrender the place whilft there was any chance of stopping the career of the enemy -He affured of speedy supplies of Durch and Pruffian troops, which would enable him to make head against the enemy even in the field. -The Commandant, notwithstanding, forrendered the place without a thot being fired, and he had the effrontery to appear in Court, to give an account of his cowardly and treacherous conduct. When the Stadtholder had heard his parrative, he ordered him to withdraw. He was immediately loaded with irons, and thrown into prison.

The Stadtholder, however, feems to be unmoved and ferene; and as fome counterbalance for the ill fortune at Breda, a Courier arrived, a few hours before the Packet failed, with the important intelligence, " that General Clairlait had attacked the French at Venlo, and, after a delper ate engagement, taken fix hundred prifoners, with their arms, and killed two thousand on the fpot."
