On Monday laft an unprecedented attachment was made by the King's Attorney General of the fum of One Hundred Thousand Pounds sterling, standing in the Bank of England in the name of Meff. Bordieu and Chollet .- The avowed pretext is, that they fulpedt this fum to belong to the Government of France, and they have filed a bill in Chancery to make the English house answer to interrogatories, upon oath, whether this fum is or is not the property of the Republic - They justify the attachment by faying-The French feized on English ships-they retaliate by feizing on French money-and the question will be brought to iffue by this means between the two countries. It will be tried before an Englifh Jury. - Balen, annageron : :

Relative to the interior affairs of France, it is faid, that discontent which has been long known to exist at Lyons, has again produced some schive resistance to the will of the National Convention ;-that three Commissioners and fix thousand troops, whom this body fent this ther, had found the gates shu', and the inhabitants armed, to the number of forty thousand men ; that the troops had withdrawn, without attempting to force an entrance, but that there was a very near profpect of a civil war between the Southern and Northern provinces.
