Let it not be faid, that in profperity you have deviated from that obsevance of religious and focial duties, which to honourably diftinguished the Irish Roman Catholics in time of advertity. Confider, above all, most feriously, that we have not a permanent refidence in this earthly city, that we should therefore pant after heavenly things; and that we cannot obtain them without practifing the duties of religion. The bare profession of it is profane mockery, and will aggravate your guilt in the light of the Lord.

"We cannot but deplore the frequent tranfgreffions of God's commandmen's: That which enjoins the fanctification of the Lord's Day, is most feandalously violated by all ranks. Heaven is usually more outraged on that than all the other days of the week, by idle and haful diffi-

Humble yourselves then in his prefence, and be fecond to no description of his Majetty's subjects in the performance of those religious sels that may render the God of Sabbath propitions to us, and to the empire.

"May the Father of Mercies and the God of all Confolation hear our prayers I For the reft, dearly beloved brethren, rejoice, be per fect, take exportation, be of one mind, have peace, and the God of Peace and of Love shall be with you."
