This day his Majefty's Attorney General moved the Court of King's Bench for two Writs of Centiorari, to bring up two indiaments found at the Affizes of Dunda k, against James N. Tandy, Eig; one for a mildemeanor in dil perfing a feditious libel entitled " Common Sense; and another for a felony in taking an unlawfol oath, commonly called the " Defen der's Oath "

The Attorney General observed, that Mr. Tandy had thought proper to forfeit his recognizance for 1001, to appear to the fift indictment, and to avoid going to Dundalk, after coming within a few miles of the town ; and he made this motion in order to proceed to an

Outlawry againft Mr. Tandy. Lord Clonmel faid, that Mr. T. in giving bail before him, had deceived him, by afferting that another Judge had demanded only 1001. bail from another person charged with disperfing the fame libel. This he found now to be untrue; and for his own part, he believed, had he feen the libel in quellion before that time, as he fince had, that he would have demanded much higher bail-perhaps to the amount of 1000

The motion was granted.
