By the London prints of Tuesday's mail, we learn, that the famous Baron Munchausen, whose more than wonderful narratives have amused and astonished all Europe for some years, is now Minister at War to his Serene Highness the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel, in which quality he has just ratified a Carcass-treaty with Lord Elgin, by which 10,000 men are given for slaughter, by their humane and benevolent Prince.
