

On Thursday, the Fleet of Merchant Ships, destined for the West Indies, sailed from Cove with the Vengeance and two Frigates.

On Tuesday night, the Rev. Mr. Blackwood Rector of Rathcormuck, got up in his sleep, and fell out of a window in the attic story of his own house, he was taken up, both senseless and speechless, he has been since scalped, and his skull found not to be fractured.
