Mr. Harvey foggested the idea of entering into a fubicription for the purpole of purchafing the goods on the hands of the manufactuvers, which, he faid, would be the means of ferting the persons out of employment immedi-

ately at work.

Mr. Berrington proposed, that the felect Committee frould be directed to lit, from time to time, in order to receive information, and to adopt fuch further refolutions as might tend to allegiate the prefent diffrelles of the working manufacturere, Affaille the Hi o's he as a

Mr. Sheares threw out the idea, that Government should purchase all the goods on the hands of the manufacturers, and that they should iffue Exchequer bills for the fame, which, he faid, would be the means of giving employment to the workmen who are now out of work.

Mr. Emmett arraigned the conduct of the Committee, in not having traced the origin of the prefent diffreffes, which he attributed to England having improdently entered into the prefent war. He made fome observations of a political nature, which were by no means relewant to the object of the meeting.
