Since the receipt of the above order, 250 men have
been attested by Colonel Smyth, and it is supposed, be-

We have heard that some Hearth Money Collectors
have refused receiving the Certificates which the Law
points out for exonerating poor Householders having but
one hearth from paying this tax—those Certificates not
being purchased from themselves;—we caution them
against a breach of an Act of Parliament, which so far
from authorizing them to act thus, obliges them to re-
ceive those Certificates whether written or printed, if
signed by a Magistrate; and we are happy to find that
there are Magistrates in this City determined to do the
Poor justice.

Last Sunday a French privateer, with English co-
lours, anchored in Ballyheige bay, Co. Kerry;—Col.
Croftie, suspecting she might be in distress, sent off
his Pinace with seven men, who were joined by six
others; the Pinace and men were directly taken on
board the privateer, who struck the English and hoisted
the French colours, and immediately set sail with men
and boat.

Sunday last, a small sail boat, in which were three
men and a woman, going from the Quay to the Pool,
upset;—providentially, at the critical moment when
they must have perished, the Brig Hero, Capt. Denny,
was towing to the Pool; with a humanity that must
ever be remembered, he cut the painter of his boat,
and the ship's crew exerted themselves with such un-
common success, that they were all taken up alive.—
The Humane Society much to their honor, ordered
three Guineas to be paid to the Sailors who thus hap-
pily rescued four fellow-creatures from an untimely
death; which was as much as their little fund could
afford. It is requested that those Gentlemen who col-
lected money from the Citizens of Limerick, will pay
said collections into the hands of Sir Matthew Blakiston,
their Treasurer.

This morning a boat, laden with clay, sunk near
Baal's Bridge; two Boatmen were on board, who
saved themselves by swimming.

There is at present a poor Man confined in the City
Gaol, for a debt of only 7l. 10s. od.—he has a Wife
and five Children, who on account of his confinement,
are drove to the greatest wretchedness, and being
Natives of the North of Ireland, have no person to
whom they could apply for relief.—The person at
whose suit he is confined, has kindly offered to take
half the Debt; Benefactions for this purpose will be
