However celebrated he has been in the field Tor personal atchievement, he is not less remarkable as a negociator, for he has been at the botom of half the intrigues that have been practifed at Paris, and he was able to purfue, and to manage and to dictate thefe, in the midft of his most hazardous enterprizes.

Prior to his succeeding to the command of La Fayette's army he had a duel with that General. They fought with fwords, and Dumourier wounded him in the fide. Of all the military men that perhaps ever lived, there is no man who has exposed himself to more perfonal hazard then Domourier. He has had various horles shot under him : he has led on regiments, both of horse and foot to the very mouth of the cannon of the enemy, and he has repeatedly rode from right to left in the midft of a heavy discharge of artillery, and back again, while the fuite that followed him have almost all been killed-Yet be never reseived the fmalleft wound.

As a Negociator, he is to be as much talked of as a Commander-for he had many Negotions with the Duke of Brunswick, some with Lord Auekland, and there is reason to believe,

fome with our Cabiner.

He had feeret correspondence during the entire of laft winter with almost every town in Holland, and at the fame time had his own party to manage in the National Convention, which was a much more difficult talk.

Dumourier, it is faid, is going to America. The dreffes of Lord Courtnay's fervants, at the concert and supper, lately given by him, were by far the most splendid ever feen in this sountry. All the coats were lined with white fatis, embroidered in gold with fleurs de lis. The hats coft twenty guineas each.
