

*Extract of a Letter from Nootka Sound, Sept. 30*  
 "I write you this by a Portuguese brig, which is now getting under weigh, with Capt. Vancouver's dispatches for England. The Spanish Government not only peremptorily refuses to deliver up this settlement to us, conformably to stipulation, but receives us in a way very unpleasant. How this affair will be considered in England, you, on the spot, will best judge."

The District of Avranèhes, on the 20th inst. passed a resolution, that it would not acknowledge or obey any Decree of the Convention, but those which its Members should have calmly discussed, without being exposed to the insults, insults, menaces, or poignards of an unbridled populace, aimed to vilify and degrade the National Representation.

Major Doyle is to succeed Col. Arabin, who died on his voyage from Barbadoes to Jamaica.

Captain Pellew, the gallant commander of La Nymphé frigate, is ordered to attend his Majesty at Windsor; but, we understand, he has, with becoming modesty, declined the honour of Knighthood.

Capt. Israel Pellew is made Post-Captain, in consequence of his auxiliary service on board his brother's frigate.—Mr. Amherst Morris, first Lieutenant of La Nymphé, is promoted to the rank of Master and Commander.

The Tartar Frigate has taken the General Washington Privateer of 20 guns and 180 men, and gone for Gibraltar.

A Deputation of the Merchants of London trading to Spain, waited on Lord Grenville, on Wednesday, with a Memorial on the subject of the sequestration of the property of the French houses in Spain; and praying, that out of the proceeds of their property, the lawful debts due by the said French houses to his Britannic Majesty's subjects should be paid. Lord Grenville, with the zeal and attention which his Lordship has always shewn to the interests of trade, assured these Gentlemen, that a copy of the Memorial should be immediately transmitted and properly recommended to Lord St. John. Lord Grenville added, that he made no doubt, from the justice of the Court of Law, that all the just and lawful demands of Britannic Majesty's subjects, against the French houses in question, would be discharged out of the proceeds of their effects, in case it should be judged expedient to proceed to their seizure and sale. We understand that the merchants of Amsterdam have followed the example of the Merchants of London, and that a Memorial, requesting similar justice to the demands of the Dutch subjects, has been transmitted to Madrid.

The woman killed in Dingle last Monday, as mentioned in our last, was designedly shot, she being perceived in a house with some of the rioters. In her two lives were lost, as she was within a few weeks of being brought to bed.—The man who fired at W. Mullins, Esq; was observed by the military, and immediately put to death.

The reason why so few fell in Dingle on Monday, was owing to the caution of the mob, who dispersed when the companies of the 34th regt. appeared, and were pursued into houses, and over ditches, where they were shot and bayoneted.—Thursday one company returned to Tralee from Dingle, the dreadful, but necessary sacrifice made there, having produced Peace.
