ing manner. The City and Neighbourhood has been in a ftate of general alarm fince Monday laft :--- On Sunday night at it o'Clock, the Mayor received an Express from Charles S. Oliver, Efq; of Caftle-Oliver, County Limerick, " that he had on that day armed a few of his tenants, and purfued a number of those misguided wretches who were administering unlawful Oaths in his neighbourhood, eleven of whom he took and lodged in Kilfinan Goal; but being apprehensive their affociates might attempt a refeue, in bringing them to this County Goal, requetted a military guard might be fent him'; ascordingly at three o'Clock on Monday morning, a Captain and 50 men of the 34th regiment, with Ter. Monfell, Eig; a Juffice of the Peace for this County, proceeded for Kilfinane :- At two o'Clock fame evening, an Express arrived that the Mob were in great force near Braff, had dilarmed a Recruiting Party coming to Limerick, and were on their way to refcue the Prisoners at Kilfinane; in consequence of which Captain Porbes, affembled the remainder of his regivnent, the recruiting parties, and a few of the City Militis, and, with two field pieces, immediately marched off to Bruff, under the command of Walter Widenham, Eiq; on entering the Village, they were fired upon by fome of the Rioters from behind walls and ont of houses, two of the Military were wounded, and one Militia Man killed; the Artillery were directly ordered to fire on those houses, which with a full discharge from the troops on the perions who were making their escape, must have made great havor among those deluded people : nor did the firing entirely lublide until about 12 o'Clock fame night, the Rioters taking the opportunity of the darkness, by firing upon the Troops as at first .- From every account given, there were more than 40 of the infatuated Peatants killed, and feveral others dangeroufly wounded, who were taken away by their friends,- Yefferday evening Captain Forbes's detachment and Artillery arrived in town, bringing with them two men priloners, who were taken in one of the houses from whence the King's troops were annoyed.

Areleven last night, C. S. Oliver, and Ter. Monfell, Efers, with the guard which left town on Montay morning, arrived and brought in 24 priloners, who were committed by Mr. Monfell to the County Goal;

The fp rited conduct of Terence Monfeil, and Walter Widenham, Efgrs. who commanded the above parties, is spoken of by the Officers and Privates as a model for all Magistrates at this time of general Riot; and the behaviour of the troops has gained for the 34th regt. the efteem of every Centleman who shared in their fatigues; it gives us pleasure to hear that the brave veteran Captain Porbes, highly approved of the thead ness of the few Militia Men who were attached to the

To give the Public an idea of the cool intrepid condoct of C. S. Oliver, Eig; would require the pen of the most able Penegyrift; on his committing the first prisoners to Kilfinan Goal, an irritated mob attacked the prison, of which he and a number of his faithful Freeholders took possession, to dislodge them and liberate the Prifoners; they fet fire to all the buildings adjoining, and placed a quantity of combustible matter in the market-house which forms the lower part of the Jail; at the inflant Mr. Oliver capied the flooring of the room he was in to be ripped up, and kept up a continued fire on the delinquents, forme of whom were killed, others taken prifoners, and the reft obliged to defert from their wicked intention .- Monday Mr. Oliver found means to fend for fome Cavalry to Millow and Clogheen from which places two troops of the 14th Regt. were instantly dispatched, and with that promptitude which at present particularly distinguishes the King's troops, arrived at Kilfinan in a fhort time .- The mob thus disappointed in their intention, leized James Langton, Efq; a Justice of the Peace for this County, on his return from Bruff, whom they kept as an hoftage, threatening him with the moll cruel death, if their affociates was not fet at liberty, at the fame time compelling him to write to Mr. Oliver that if he did not comply with their demand, that on return of the mellenger, who was Mr. Langton's fervant, they would instantly hang him; for which purpose, a woman who compoled one of his guard absolutely tore her thift in ftrips and formed it into a Cord :- On Mr. Oliver's confulting Mr. Langton's friends, he determined not to write an aniwer, but directed the fervant to fay they were all liberated; this had not the defired effect on the mob, who were about to execute their tstal purpole, when they were alarmed by the approach of Captain Forbes's detachment, and fled to the affiftance of their affociates at Bruff, at which time Mr. Langton fortunately elcaped.
